This series is for people who have already taken an NVC mediation workshop, class, or equivalent. With a more experienced group the practice and learning will start at a more advanced level. The same learning structure will be used as in our Foundations of NVC Mediation trainings (see below), however, in this series there will be the opportunity to work with more difficult and challenging role plays, use actual conflicts from participants' own lives and have them mediated by other class participants, and work with whatever conflicts in the group that arise during the series. In terms of content, more complex, fluid, and subtle applications of the mediation model will be worked with. The practice, learning, and connection tend to deepen significantly as the series progresses.

As with the Foundations of NVC Mediation trainings, this series will be very experiential and practice-oriented in its learning, involving demonstrations, role-plays, and group harvestings of the learning and insights gained. In the role plays, you will have a chance to be both mediator and disputant. As an observer you will have the opportunity to move into the mediator's chair and put into practice what you've just learned, and then receive invaluable feedback from those in the disputant roles and from those observing. There is a back and forth flow between practice and feedback, and being in the whole group and in small groups. John and Ike actively coach, facilitate, and share their experience throughout.
